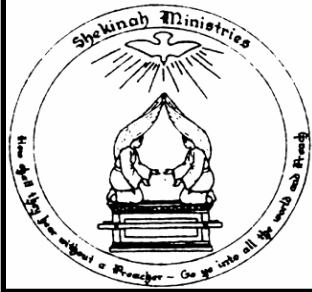

Beloved Partners & Friends,

The Church – that is you and me – has been so deceived and seduced by the teachings and practice of liberal humanism that most actually believe it to be true. The sum of this diabolic teaching is that the end or goal for man is his pleasure and happiness. This is so far removed from the Biblical teaching that the ultimate purpose for man is the glory of God. The one exalts self, whilst the latter exalts the Lord. They are diametrically opposed teachings. One is out of darkness and the other light. To glorify man or self in any fashion is to glorify sin for David declared, *“Behold I was shapen in iniquity, and in sin did my mother conceive me.”* (Ps 51: 5) Iniquity and sin are the foundations of every living creature for the corrupted, rebellious nature of Adam is our root. *“But thanks be to God who giveth us the victory (over sin) through our Lord Jesus Christ.”* It is time that each of us did some deep serious accounting of our lives and realized just how accountable we are to the Lord. However can we teach and preach with power and authority if the very things against which we speak are the very things we practice? The Pharisees were just such type of people and the Lord called them hypocrites because in effect they told the people, “don’t do what we do, do what we say.” They quoted the law but failed to make it part of their own lives. If you will not forgive, neither will your heavenly father forgive you. Today, there is no deep true conviction of sin. This is because we preach a shallow Gospel message or none at all. It is the deep conviction of sin that brings true repentance, gives us spiritual authority and ushers us into the presence of the Lord. There would be no need for our type of gimmicky preaching and church conduct to “get the people.” There would be no need for preachers to compromise and behave like the

people with their slang, frivolity, irreverence and dress all in an effort to identify rather than to make people rise up to a higher level. If there was a true, deep conviction of sin, we would not have to plead for men to be saved but they would rather cry out: “What must I do to be saved?” Today, the populist gospel excludes the conviction of sin and demands rather, a mere intellectual assent to the fact and sufficiency of Christ’s atonement. “Flimsy and false conversions may be one reason why so many who assume the Christian profession dishonor God and bring reproach on the Church by their inconsistent lives, and by their ultimate relapses into worldliness and sin.” (J. Lord) God has placed his own true value on His Word. He declares it a “FIRE,” a “HAMMER,” and a “SWORD.” *“But your iniquities have separated between you and your God, and your sins have hid his face from you.”* (Is 59: 2)

1. Do I say one thing and do another? Are my words and my actions inconsistent thereby making me a hypocrite?
2. Have I forgiven everyone? Is there malice, hatred, spite or enmity in my heart? Do I hold grudges against anyone?
3. Do I get angry? Do I easily lose my temper and wrath takes hold of me?
4. Are there feelings of jealousy? When another is preferred before me does it make me envious and uncomfortable?
5. Do I get impatient and irritated? Do little things annoy and vex me?
6. Am I easily offended? Do I get upset if I am ignored, passed over, neglected?
7. Is there pride in my heart? Am I puffed up and think more highly of myself than I should?
8. Have I been dishonest? Am I above reproach in all my dealings?
9. Am I a gossip? Do I take pleasure in slandering the character of others because of my own inadequacy?
10. Am I critical and like criticizing others, always finding fault with them? This is a religious spirit that destroys many fellowships.
11. Do I rob God? Have I stolen time that belongs to Him? Have I denied worship to Him? Have I withheld finances that are His?

12. Am I worldly? Do I love the show, pomp and glitter of this life?

If my answer to any of them is “yes,” then let us be honest and call them by their right name, “SIN.” God says that our iniquities have separated us from Him and our sins have hid His face from us. This is why so many believers do not prosper. As soon as we recognize, confess and forsake our ways, we will experience the blessings of the Lord, the greatest being the feeling of His tangible presence.

## NEWS FROM KALIBU ACADEMY AND BIBLE SCHOOL

Second Annual Speech Night was held on 9<sup>th</sup> of October in the Stan Newton Hall at Kalibu Academy. It is the most important event of the year when the best performing and most improved students are rewarded for their scholastic achievements. This is a great encouragement for them and also a great challenge for others. Hundreds of parents came to participate in this event and after the ceremony special guests were invited to have dinner together with the Headmaster and other members of the administration.

It is a busy time in Kalibu Academy now. Our Form Four students started their check point exams and Form Five and AS and A2 students started writing the IGCSE Cambridge examinations. Our head boy writes his finals and will return to the United States mid December to prepare for entrance to Lindenwood University, St. Louis in January where he will pursue a BA in Education and a Masters in Education Administration so that he will be fully equipped to return one day and take over as Headmaster of Kalibu Academy.



A new dining hall is under construction. The foundations are laid and main supporting poles as well. After the new hall is finished, the old one will be used for students for prep-time. The new hall will be as big again as the assembly hall. For the past year it has been more and more difficult to fit our students into the old hall and very uncomfortable for our kitchen staff. With the new hall will come modern kitchens with electrical cooking pots from Finland. No more using wood for cooking

The third cottage for the boarding staff is completed. With the growth of the school we need more and more boarding staff to take care of the students in boarding. We are really happy to see that the construction of the third cottage is finished and all inside works are done. The teachers are moving into these in a few days.

The fifth cottage for missionaries is complete

Another piece of good news is that one of two new cottages for missionaries is built and all interior works done. We are waiting for two lovely families to join our ministry in Malawi – Errol and Davral Lobb from Zimbabwe and Pekka and Raija Kailajarvi from Finland. Errol and Davral were a part of our church decades ago in Chipinge and have been pastoring just north of Harare in Zimbabwe for the past number of years. They made the decision earlier this year to join us and will head up the ministry side of Kalibu along with Christopher Navaya. Pekka and Raija have been faithful attendees of our annual conference in Finland and will come out and head up contracting as well as work alongside Errol and Davral on ministry outreach.



### Ceremony of giving wheel chairs to the elderly

Few weeks ago there was a heart-touching ceremony in the Stan Newton hall at the Academy of handing out the wheel chairs to the elderly people. Students and their parents respond with enthusiasm to the call to take part in the elderly people project and they continue to contribute to it with their money, clothes and other things. Next weekend we are having a Gospel singer performing at the school and all funds raised will go for elderly people.

Another piece of wonderful news is that this week a bore hole will be drilled in Nsanje for the elderly village. Thanks to a church in Ohio which raised the funds for this.



### Fuel tank is installed at Kalibu Academy

It seems that again a major fuel crisis has started here in Malawi. It is more and more difficult to get diesel (it was an even more critical situation last December). That's why it was so important to have the ministry and school's own fuel tank and be ready for times like these. There is a real lack of foreign currency in the country.



Also we are happy to share that we have been able to purchase land for the cattle in the Chikwawa district just south of Blantyre which means that in the near future the school will have its own meat supply. We are importing grass seed and will lay down pasture which will be irrigated. With the present size of the school we need to have our own herd of cattle. Organic grass fed cattle without any hormones. Eat your heart out in the West where such meat is so expensive.

### Mission trip to Mulanje

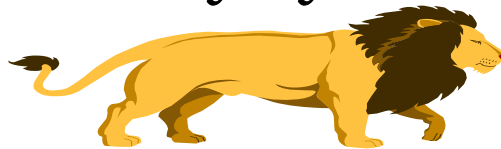
